**SOCIAL WORKER- 20%

This **temporary part-time position** will be available as of July 1, 2019 until June 30, 2020 at Harold Napper School located at 6375 Baffin in Brossard.

ASSIGNMENT:

The position of social worker encompasses, in particular, responsibility for prevention, promotion, detection and intervention activities with students and groups of students experiencing or likely to experience emotional, social, school or family problems to ensure that the conditions are in place to foster their psychosocial development.

DESCRIPTION OF TASKS:

The social worker contributes to the detection of difficulties and identification of students experiencing problems, using an approach focussing on prevention and intervention; he or she evaluates students experiencing social, family, personal or school problems by means of a study and compilation of the information contained in the student's record, direct observation or interviews, consultations and questionnaires; he or she conducts psychosocial evaluations; he or she sees that a psychosocial treatment plan is developed, prepared and implemented and ensures the child's psychosocial follow-up.

He or she works with a multidisciplinary team to draw up, implement and review a student's individualized education plan, while taking into account the personal, family, school and social context to help him or her overcome his or her problems as well as to develop and maintain his or her motivation in school; he or she works with other team members to harmonize and coordinate interventions and to assess the achievement of objectives.

He or she conducts individual or group counselling sessions with students and ensures follow-up with parents; he or she may refer the student or his or her parents to resources appropriate for the situation and needs; he or she works with representatives of partner organizations.

He or she provides advice and support to teachers and to other school resources to better meet the student's needs and to provide necessary support and supervision to ensure the student's progress and success in school.

He or she participates in the preparation, promotion and delivery of detection, awareness-building and prevention programs on topics related to the problems experienced by youths.

He or she advises management staff, prepares expertise, evaluation, briefing and progress reports and formulates appropriate recommendations to support decision making.

He or she may be called upon to help defuse crisis or emergency situations and to recommend solutions.

He or she prepares and updates files according to the standards related to the practice of the profession and the rules defined by the school board; he or she prepares progress notes or evaluation, end-of-process and follow-up reports on his or her interventions.

QUALIFICATIONS :

Be a member of the *Ordre professionnel des travailleurs sociaux du Québec*.

ANNUAL SALARY: \$9,222.80 to \$16,517.00 per 7-hour week, according to qualifications and experience.
