Adam's P.A.C.E.



Adam's P.A.C.E. is a joint project between the Riverside School and Champlain College Saint Lambert that provides an inclusive post-secondary option for students, aged 18 to 21, with intellectual and/or pervasive developmental disabilities. This innovative transition program opens doors to a vocational future through classroom learning and community work experiences. It aims to prepare each student for the independent pursuit of a successful adult life, to the best of his or her ability.

Each student expresses the desire to feel as though they are an integral part of their community. Every student wants to establish friendships and community ties.

F.A.C.T.

F.A.C.T. (Friendship and Community Ties) is a project developed by Adam's P.A.C.E. and McGill University to help the students achieve their goals of community involvement.

The purpose of the F.A.C.T. project is to improve the students' connections to his or her community.

The goal of the project is to help the students create friendships and community awareness so that they will ultimately experience an improved quality of life.



F.A.C.T. Components

1. Friendship Program

Students and volunteers will participate in weekly one-on-one activities as well as group activities.

2. Community Program

The purpose of the workshops is to inform parents and students about the services available to them in their community and the steps involved to make these valuable connections.
