

Our Community Connections

1. South Shore Reading Council – Provided training for all of our volunteer high school students to provide free after school tutoring.
2. H.O.P.E. (Helping Other People Effectively) – Delivered in class discussions on empathy as well as the goal of their charitable organization.
3. HRHS IB Program – Volunteers are recruited through the IB program who deliver after school tutoring at no cost.
4. CRHS – Provide student volunteers to our after school tutoring program
5. Kids Code Jeunesse – Offered free in class micro:bit coding course to 4 classes. Also donated 10 micro:bit computers to all classes involved.
6. TD Canadian Children’s Book Week – An author animated a workshop on her writing process to encourage our students love for reading and writing.
7. Greenfield Park Library – A strong school partner, they provided space to display our students artwork to be on display for the public. They also animated literacy activities at the library itself for specific classes.
