Enrollment for the 2019/2020 school year was 212 students; increasing the number of student 5 years in a row; reflecting the reputation that our school has acquired along the years.

At BES, about 75% of the students come from francophone families. Classes are offered to students from kindergarten to grade 6. Daycare services are also available to families. Thanks to the amazing work of our passionate principal Jenny Brousseau, who will remain with us another year, the students attend a school that welcomes diversity in a safe and friendly environment. Along with her wonderful staff, she achieved amazing results this year, which can be easily witnessed when visiting the school. She constantly finds ways to improve the school setting for all the students, teachers, support staff and parents to work harmoniously together and cultivate a great environment for learning. Mrs. Brousseau also ensures that our building is kept functional. Her regular communications with RSB ensure that we have all the resources available for our students. She continually seeks to receive the appropriate support for children showing special needs in education or behavior.

BES offers an English-program of studies and complies with MEES guidelines for subjects taught. Part of a pilot project by Educational Services, the school offered for a third year the French immersion course, combined with a couple other subjects taught in French.

For a second consecutive year, "I Can Je Peux" was the theme featured for this school year. The great BES team enforced within each student that they can make a difference, they can strive to achieve anything they want in their hearts and minds if they are willing to work for it. Perseverance and determination were enforced throughout the year.

As part of the Educational Project 19-22, the Mission, Vision and Values were reviewed last year. They stress what the school is all about – to be a place where students can grow and learn and become our future active members of the society.


Mission Statement

Their ideas and creativity ensure our youth to grow in the best environment there is. As such, the GB supports fundraising activities, which are cause-driven and in-line with the school's theme and mission. The PPO does an extraordinary job in planning and organizing the many fundraising activities throughout the school year. Due to the school closing mid-March, some of the planned and budgeted fundraising activities were however postponed to next year and redirected; therefore the school yard will be revamped this summer and added to the myriad of tools offered to our 223 students registered for the 2020-2021 school year. As of note, it's important to highlight all the time and efforts that the PPO is investing in our school. As an example, they took the time to write a letter to both the Boucherville's City Councilor and the School Commissioner responsible for our school area. With their actions, combined with those of our Principal, the road signs in front of the school were changed, to the better safety of all students and parents during rush hours.

To diminish negative effects on learning and well-being, the teachers completed the school year by continuing to provide quality education through distance learning tools like Zoom. Teachers are teaching for the kids, being there for them while helping them learn and grow. Distance learning is not the way they learned to teach, nor the way the wanted to teach; however, all of them stepped up and did it brilliantly, for the sake of all students.

On a more collective aspect, to keep in touch with all the students and their families, the staff had brilliant ideas. Amongst them, they published weekly birthday videos for students and staff, and book reading videos were also shared on our BES' Facebook page to maintain a connection with the students.

They did not stop there. Even before the government announced that 6th graders would have a final day at the school for their graduation, the staff had scheduled two important celebrations. On June 18th, 6th graders were invited to celebrate the end of their elementary years, and on June 19th, kindergarten's students celebrated their important milestone.

LOOKING AHEAD

The GB plays a vital role not only administratively but its members also act as stewards in the success of the school. In concert with parents, teachers, administrative staff, community partners, the school board and sister schools, but most importantly its students, the GB aims to encourage and develop lifelong learners and compassionate citizens. Our "future leaders" need cultivation and support to continuously foster and encourage that sense of curiosity they have as small children.

Bill-40 will bring many changes to School Board management. Changes that will affect directly the GB. The next Annual General Assembly will be critical. As of July 31st, every GB member's term comes to an end. In addition, our numbers will grow from 6 to 12 members; therefore adding 1 parent and 1 member from the community, which could be a challenge. Decisions and elections will have to be made, in order to keep a resemblance of continuity and to get some stability in those changing times.

In the mix of it all, students are and will still be our priority. To do so, the activities that were postponed and mentioned earlier will be perfect next year. Epique program will offer training sessions for all levels of

anxiety, from Breath Training Techniques for Kindergartens and Cycle 1 to Implementing Solutions for Cycle 3; ensuring that all students' mental health is prioritised to start another year at BES. Respectfully,
