2014-2015 SCHOOL CALENDAR: YOUTH SECTOR

RATIFICATION OF AN AUTHORIZATION FOR SUPPLEMENTARY WORK CARRIED OUT AT GOOD SHEPHERD SCHOOL

WHEREAS Riverside School Board adopted resolution MR247-20130326 awarding a contract for the refurbishment of washrooms at Good Shepherd School for a cost of \$170,845;

WHEREAS Riverside adopted resolution MR267-20130827 where it was necessary to negotiate and agree to an amendment to the contract to deal with urgent work related to the structure and air quality in the building requested and supervised by a structural engineer and industrial hygienist done under the delegation of the Director General which increased the cost of construction by a maximum of \$35,000.00:

WHEREAS the estimate of the professionals and the entrepreneur of a maximum of \$35,000.00 was sufficient to deal with the urgent work related to the structure and air quality:

WHEREAS for other non-urgent work related to unforeseen conditions, the entrepreneur has requested a supplementary amount of \$9,736.75, without taxes, or 5.7% of the original amount;

WHEREAS the technical work was necessary and that the costs were controlled and accepted by the professionals concerned;

WHEREAS supplementary monies are available within the 2013-2014 capital budget of Riverside School Board:

WHEREAS according to the «Loi sur les contrats des organismes publics», the Council of Commissioners must ratify extra expenditures to contracts awarded from a public bid once the amount of extra costs of 10% is exceeded;





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
