

## Educational Project: St. Lambert International HS Mid-Year Report – April 2021

Our Educational Project has emerged from the collective reflection of our school staff and through consultation with our school community. It stems from our specific contexts, realities and needs. This is created in the best interest of our students and their on-going success. It outlines the challenges, orientations and objectives that we, as a school, have chosen to prioritize. #### **M**ID-YEAR REFLECTION AND ADJUSTMENTS

TEACHERS, RESOURCE PERSONNEL AND LEVEL LEADERS CONTINUE TO MEET REGULARLY TO DISCUSS THE PROGRESS OF STUDENTS. WE NEED A COMMON UNDERSTANDING OF THE SUPPORT PROVIDED TO STUDENTS AND TO OFFER CONSISTENCY IN ALL OUR INTERVENTIONS.

WE CONTINUE TO IDENTIFY OUR STUDENTS GETTING 69% AND LOWER IN ELA AND FRENCH. WE OFFER SUPPORT SO THAT WE CAN BRING UP THEIR MARKS AND ACHIEVE AT LEAST 70% IN BOTH LANGUAGES.

77% OF OUR STUDENTS ACHIEVE (60% AND MORE) IN BOTH LANGUAGES. BY OFFERING MORE RESOURCES, WE WANT OUR STUDENTS TO SUCCEED AT A HIGHER LEVEL AND ATTAIN OUR TARGET.

TEACHERS, RESOURCE TEAM AND LEVEL LEADERS HAVE MET REGULARLY TO DISCUSS THE PROGRESS OR CHALLENGES OF IDENTIFIED STUDENTS. OUR DISCUSSIONS HELP US TO BETTER UNDERSTAND THE STUDENTS' PROFILE SO WE CAN STRUCTURE OUR SERVICES TO PROVIDE MORE EFFECTIVE HELP TO THE STUDENTS.

OUR SCHOOL SURVEY WILL BE ADMINISTERED IN THE NEXT FEW WEEK SO WE CAN COLLECT AND COMPARE OUR RESULTS WITH RESULTS FROM PREVIOUS YEARS.

Our goal is to reduce the level of anxiety of our students. However, we are aware the pandemic is having an effect on our students and they are experiencing challenges. Since we cannot offer group support settings at this time, we take the time to connect individually with them and do regular follow ups.

STAFF, STUDENTS, GB MEMBERS, RSB'S COMPLEMENTARY SERVICES, SCHOOL ADMINISTRATION STAFF AND OUR COMMUNITY PARTNERS ARE REVIEWING OUR AV/AB PLAN. THE INTENTION OF THIS REVIEW PROCESS IS TO BETTER DEFINE THE ISSUES AND ALSO CREATE A CULTURE OF UNDERSTANDING REGARDING VERBAL, PHYSICAL OR CYBER VIOLENCE. WE BELIEVE THAT THE PROMOTION OF OUR PLAN AND THE INVOLVEMENT OF STUDENTS WILL HAVE A DIRECT IMPACT ON OUR STUDENTS AND COMMUNITY.

#### **MID-YEAR REFLECTION AND ADJUSTMENTS**

DUE TO THE PANDEMIC AND THE GUIDELINES PRESENTED BY SANTÉ PUBLIQUE, IT HAS BEEN A CHALLENGE TO ORGANIZE CLUBS, SPORTING TEAM, AFTERSCHOOL ACTIVITIES AND LUNCHTIME GROUPS.
