7. Reports

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7.1. GB Chairperson report

- I participated in both the Cycle 2 & 3 trip at Bromont. These events provided an excellent introduction to skiing and snowboarding for students. It was enjoyable and rewarding to see the students learn how to ski and snowboard.
- It seems better to have the date before March as in March the weather could be too mild.

7.2. Parent Committee Representative

7.3. P.P.O. Chairperson

- No representative. Sandra reported that there will be more involvement in April & May with nutrition month and fitness week.

7.4. Principal Report

- 272 students registered for the 2025/2026 school year.
- English program is projected to have 137 students k to grade 6.
- Immersion program is projected to have 144 students k to grade 6.
- There seems to be a preference for parents to enroll their child in the immersion program. Registration goes until April. Immersion K is full and English K has 1 or 2 spots.
- It is projected there will be 2 split classes in the English program. The Immersion program will have 2 grade 5 classes.
- Anti-Bullying/Anti-Violence committee will be meeting in a couple of weeks and would like to implement a PBIS (Positive Behavioral Intervention & Support) approach.
- Sandra and a staff member were invited to the school board for a ceremony for Truth and Reconciliation with elders and representatives from the Mohawk community. The school received its' plaque. Mountainview is not on Mohawk territory but Abenaki. We have not displayed Mountainview's plaque yet as we need to acknowledge the Abenaki territory.
- Parent Conference on February 6th had a low turnout due to the snow. Those that did attend appreciated the conference. The food and babysitting was appreciated. A suggestion was made to have the conferences recorded.
- In April Sandra will be hosting coffee with the principal at the MEPEQ office in Beloeil. Inviting parents to come and chat with her.

7.6. Daycare Report

- April 22 Lumberjack Theme Party. There is no extra charge for this activity. Students will get 2 snacks, pancakes with fruit, swiss rolls. There will be some activities.

7.7. Teacher Report

- Cycle 2 & 3 ski trip was enjoyed by students.
- Teachers held their winter parent teacher meetings.
- Cycle 3 students attended a concert at the OSM. Very well organized and appreciated.
- The trip to the Beloeil pool went well.
- Cycle 3 students went to see a vernissage and concert at Heritage. It was nice to see former Mountainview students performing and displaying their art.
- Sliding at Michel Chartrand went well, but it seems they may have overbooked as there was a big group of teenage kids. At certain times Mountainview teachers had to intervene as the teens were not mindful of the younger children.

8. Business arising (from December minutes)

- Lockdown Practice- Post Event Update
 - Lockdown practice on March 18th went well. Le Petit Loutre daycare was at our school, but they knew exactly what to do and went into Brigitte's equipment room.
- School Deficit Situation
 - 100 000 in deficit. The board is covering 50 000, we need to recoup 50 000, over 3 years. It is projected that we could recoup the first 17 000, to be confirmed in July. Remainder of maple fundraiser after Grade 6 will go to specific destination fund. GB could decide where the funds could be used.
- Models of Delivery- Subject-T-A Changes Over Time
 - Some families are leaving Mountainview because they want more French, even in the immersion program.
 - 50% of Grade 6 students attend a French High School
 - Models of delivery are based on demographic factors. Most of our students come from French speaking homes, and many enroll in the Immersion program.
 - We could attract more families to the English program by offering more French by offering Français Langue Immersion which is more elevated than Français de Base.
 - In the fall Cycle 2 would receive Français Langue immersion with the necessary resource support.
 - Discussions revolved around why parents chose Mountainview as well as the mode of instruction. Sandra would like to survey the population to get a sense as to the factors that attract them to Mountainview.
 - Governing Board parents mentioned it is a good idea to promote a higher level of French to allow them to function in Quebec.
 - It was discussed that perhaps families want to retain their rights to English education.
 - We cannot have Français Langue Enseignement in English Elementary Schools.
 - Most of the parent population may not be aware that some RSB high schools offer the same level of French as French schools
