Increase the number of students who report feeling safe at school.
Decrease the number of incidents related to bullying and violence.
Reduce the proportion of students experiencing moderate to severe anxiety and depression at school.
Implement a structured process aimed at improving the overall school climate.

Actions / Initiatives to Maintain or Let Go (Prevention Measures)

We are continuing the prevention measures already in place. We are also exploring the possibility of offering a new workshop for students and families about cybercrime, in partnership with our CLSC nurse.

Actions / Initiatives to Maintain or Let Go (Sexual Violence)

We are maintaining the prevention measures already in place regarding sexual violence. This year, the presentations offered by Maison de Jonathan were very successful with our older students, and we would like to repeat the experience next year.

Actions / Initiatives to Maintain or Let Go (Bullying or violence based on motives related, in particular, to skin colour and ethnic or national background)

Continue the initiatives led by the Diversity and Inclusion Committee, as well as the promotion of various workshops aimed at developing positive self-affirmation and appropriate responses when faced with discriminatory comments or actions.

Actions / Initiatives to Develop

We need to develop a better procedure for students to report incidents when they are afraid of the repercussions of speaking up about what happened. Some students are concerned about being perceived as “snitches” and fear stronger retaliation from their bullies when they report situations to adults. In the code of conduct, we will remind bystanders of their responsibilities in reporting acts they witness, we will remind students of the responsibility of the adults to keep witness testimony confidential and remind students of the possibility of reporting anonymously. Also, we will continue to prioritize the development of positive student-staff relations, which promotes trust and provides the necessary conditions for reporting.
