ABAV Priorities

- Increase students' feelings of safety.
- Increase staff and student awareness of violence and bullying.

• Actions / Initiatives to Maintain or Let Go (Prevention Measures)

- Maintain our current system of supervision of bathrooms: only one set of junior washrooms and one set of senior washrooms are open during class time. These washrooms are supervised by lunch monitors and require a hall pass to gain entry. More washrooms are open during lunch and are actively supervised.
- To ensure all incident reports are investigated as soon as possible.
- To address ongoing issues with students vaping in bathrooms, inside the school, and on school grounds.
- To educate students on the consequences of sharing inappropriate media (through photos and/or video) which can include police intervention and investigations.
- To educate students on appropriate/safe use of online platforms.
- Maintain sensitization meetings in collaboration with our community liaison officer for students involved in ongoing or recurring incident reports and/or physical violence or intimidation in various forms.
- Maintain vaping sensitization sessions in collaboration with the Riverside School Board Student Advisory Committee.

- **Actions / Initiatives to Maintain or Let Go (Sexual Violence)**

- Offer information sessions given by the community liaison police officer, for all Secondary 1, 2 and 3 students to educate them about sexual violence, specifically the sharing of inappropriate pictures.
- To improve students' understanding of the meaning and implications of consent.
- CCQ/Sexuality of Education Curriculum and support from Board consultants/Social Services Officers- Claude Morin and Eva Kudzman-Blais.
- Entente with Maison Jonathan.
- Sexto Project- With the help of a specialized organization, raise student awareness about sharing intimate images (sexting).
- Club offered to students who identify as LGBTQ+.
- School nurse offering sessions and education to students on safe sexual practices.

- **Actions / Initiatives to Maintain or Let Go (Bullying or violence based on motives related, in particular, to skin colour and ethnic or national background)**

- Workshops for students on positive self-affirmation and appropriate responses when faced with discriminatory statements or actions.
- Student assemblies in September and January where the subject of respect for all students is discussed.

- **Actions / Initiatives to Develop**

- Fostering awareness regarding the new ABAV plan by sharing the plan on our school website; actively mentioning the plan in discussions with students, staff, and the parent community; and discussing the plan with students in student assemblies.
- Continued awareness sessions on safety being the responsibility of all stakeholders within the school community.
- More involvement of behaviour technicians in the investigation of incident reports.
- Sharing more information on appropriate and safe use of social media platforms to address bullying and intimidation, in collaboration with our community liaison officer.
- Witnesses to bullying who may have directly or indirectly contributed to escalating a situation will be made aware of the implications of their actions and may be issued a consequence.
